**ROAD TRAFFIC ACT
(CAP. 218)**

Road Traffic (Restriction of Use of Motor Cycle) Regulations, 2020

[Gazetted 4th June, 2020]

The Minister, in exercise of the power conferred by section 66(1) (o) of the Road Traffic Act (Revised Edition, 2013), makes these Regulations.

- Citation. **1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Restriction of use of Motor Cycle) Regulations, 2020.
- Interpretation. **2.** In these Regulations, unless where the context otherwise requires,
No. 4 of 2010 “essential services” has the meaning given to it in section 2 of the Labour Code, 2010;
No. 10 of 2007 “private security service provider” has the meaning given to it in section 2 of the Private Security Industry Act, 2007.
- Prohibition of use of motor cycles on a public road.
Penalty. **3.** No person shall, between the hours of 5:00 pm to 5:00 am daily, drive a motor cycle on any road.
4. A person who contravenes regulation 3 commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding three thousand dollars.
- Exemptions. **5.** These Regulations shall not apply to a person specified in the Schedule while he or she is traveling to, or from, work.
- Regulations to cease to apply. **6.** These Regulations shall cease to apply on the 25th day of June 2020.
